3. Public Comment  

Public comment will be taken during this agenda item. Comments may be limited to three minutes per person at the discretion of the chairperson. 4. Approval of Minutes from the April 27, 2021 Nevada Commission for Women Meeting – Chair Jo Etta Brown (**For Possible Action**) **Ann Silver motioned to approve, they were seconded by Durette Candito and it passes unanimously.**

Commissioner Heather Engle said they were wonderful and hoped they will be continued and thanked the group. Chair Jo Etta Brown said she would like to also see the workshops continue either in person or virtual.

NCFW Pay Parity -Possible “White Paper”, Survey - Commissioner Ann Silver **(Discussion only)** Commissioner Ann Silver wanted to see if there is any interest in pursuing the subject of Pay Parity as a goal for the Commission. She is willing to reach out to the Chamber of Commerce and CEO’s she is in contact with. Vice Chair Durette Candito and Commissioners Heather Engle and Richann Bender said they are interested in pursuing this issue for future agendas and as a topic for the Commission. Vice Chair Durette Candito suggested posting on Facebook as a discussion topic. Commissioner Richann Bender is willing to explore the topic with the National Association for Women.

In 1963, the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs proposed that state governors create commissions patterned after the Presidential Commission. According to files in the Research Library, in 1964 Governor Grant Sawyer created Nevada's first Commission on the Status of Women by executive order. The second commission was created in 1967 by Governor Paul Laxalt. The structure for both of these commissions included a chair, two vice chairs, and seven committees-citizenship, community service, education, employment, legislation, public information, and social insurance and taxes.

In 1969 and 1971, legislation was introduced in the Nevada Legislature to create in statute a commission on the status of women. Both bills failed. In 1975, Governor Mike O'Callaghan changed the Commission on the Status of Women to a focus on the status of people. The Governor authorized the new commission to investigate state laws that discriminate against all Nevadans. It would appear that this commission was discontinued sometime after 1975.

#### Nevada Commission for Women

In 1991, Senate Bill 574 was enacted to create the Nevada Commission for Women. According to minutes of the hearings, supporters argued that a commission would act as a clearinghouse for information. Opponents argued that such a commission would promote a feminist political agenda. This bill contained an expiration date of July 1, 1995.

The expiration date was repealed by Assembly Bill 116 in 1995. In addition, A.B. 116 included an appropriation of \$10,000.

The Research Library has among its holdings the *Report to the Governor and the Legislative Commission, Nevada Commission for Women (1992, 1993)*, which was required by NRS 2331.050, until that report was deleted in 2013 with the passage of S.B. 405.

In addition, the Research Library has the following publications produced by the Commission:

- *Nevada Women's Legal Guide*, Nevada Commission for Women (1995); and
- *Domestic Violence: A Handbook for Victims and Professionals*, Nevada Commission for Women (1998).

In the *Directory of State and Local Government*, the last listing of members was in 1999.


#### Conclusion

**NRS 2331.020 Legislative declaration: creation; membership; designation of Chair and Vice Chair; terms and reappointment of officers.**

1. The Legislature hereby finds and declares that the creation of the Nevada Commission for Women is necessary to advance women toward full equality in all areas.
2. The Nevada Commission for Women, consisting of 10 members appointed by the Governor is hereby created.
3. The members appointed to the Commission must, insofar as practicable, reflect the diversity of this State, including, without limitation, the varied political philosophies regarding issues of concern to women.
4. The Governor shall designate one member of the Commission to serve as Chair and one member of the Commission to serve as Vice Chair.
5. Each Chair, Vice Chair and other officer of the Commission shall serve for a term of 1 year and may be appointed for one additional term.
6. No more than 5 members of the Commission may be from the same political party.
