3. Public Comment

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- 4. Approval of Minutes from the April 27, 2021 Nevada Commission for Women Meeting Chair Jo Etta Brown (For Possible Action) Ann Silver motioned to approve, they were seconded by Durette Candito and it passes unanimously.
- 5. Overview NCFW Purpose, Mission, and possible retreat Fall 2021 (**Discussion Only**) Chair JoEtta Brown proposed an in-person retreat in September or October, to update the mission statement, our purpose, the history of this commission and get to know the Commissioners.

- 6. Report NCFW Virtual Empowerment Workshops Vice Chair Durette Candito (**Discussion Only**) Vice Chair Durette Candito thanked Commissioners Flor Bernal-Gonzalez, Heather Engle, Diane Fearon, Jennifer Lopez, and Jennifer Rodgers-Markwell for assisting with the Virtual Empowerment Workshops. Vice Chair Durette Candito said this is her last term and she hopes that the workshops will continue. There were 7 workshops which were recoded on Facebook and are available for viewing. Comments: from Commissioner Jennifer Rodgers-Markwell said they were terrific and received a lot of good feedback from them and thanked the group for their work. Commissioner Heather Engle said they were wonderful and hoped they will be continued and thanked the group. Chair Jo Etta Brown said she would like to also see the workshops continue either in person or virtual.
- 7. NCFW Pay Parity -Possible "White Paper", Survey Commissioner Ann Silver (**Discussion only**) Commissioner Ann Silver wanted to see if there is any interest in pursuing the subject of Pay Parity as a goal for the Commission. She is willing to reach out to the Chamber of Commerce and CEO's she is in contact with. Vice Chair Durette Candito and Commissioners Heather Engle and Richann Bender said they are interested in pursuing this issue for future agendas and as a topic for the Commission. Vice Chair Durette Candito suggested posting on Facebook as a discussion topic. Commissioner Richann Bender is willing to explore the topic with the National Association for Women.

Nevada Commission for Women

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NRS 2331.020 Legislative declaration: creation; membership; designation of Chair and Vice Chair; terms and reappointment of officers.

- 1. The Legislature hereby finds and declares that the creation of the Nevada Commission for Women is necessary to advance women toward full equality in all areas.
- 2. The Nevada Commission for Women, consisting of 10 members appointed by the Governor is hereby created.
- 3. The members appointed to the Commission must, insofar as practicable, reflect the diversity of this State, including, without limitation, the varied political philosophies regarding issues of concern to women.
- 4. The Governor shall designate one member of the Commission to serve as Chair and one member of the Commission to serve as Vice Chair.
- 5. Each Chair, Vice Chair and other officer of the Commission shall serve for a term of 1 year and may be appointed for one additional term.
- 6. No more than 5 members of the Commission may be from the same political party.

SUBJECT: Elevate Her Website

On June 22, 2021, I spoke with Liz Mumford who is one of the owners of Mabble Media. We talked about the Commission taking over the Elevate Her website and how things were set up with the past contract that we had through Fior Partners. Initially Mabble Media set up the website as a pro bono project and handed it off to Molly. Molly was supposed to let Mabble Media know if any edits were needed but there was no maintenance plan or goals in place so the website was not being taken care of like it should have been and the domain went down.

Mrs. Mumford told me that her company can provide training sessions that would involve navigating and updating text on the website and the fee for each session would be \$150.00 per hour. If training sessions end up being less than an hour the price would range from \$75.00 to \$150.00. The Commission would also need to establish a state contract through Mabble Media to develop a maintenance plan. This would prevent the Commission from the problems they had in the past where the website went down without anyone's knowledge. The monthly maintenance plan is \$125.00 where Mabble Media conducts a sweep of the site once a month. If the Commission needs to call Mrs. Mumford for any problems that may occur before the monthly maintenance, then there would be an additional fee between \$150.00 to \$300.00 per hour. Mabble Media generally takes one to two hours for correcting problems depending on what changes were made.

It seems clear that the Commission would save its resources by using the existing Commission for Women website within the State's content management system instead of updating and maintaining a separate Elevate Her website. The State web services staff and I can work on keeping the Commission for Women website updated and there would already be a maintenance plan in place that the Commission would not have to pay any additional fees to maintain. We can transfer the content from the Elevate Her website to the Commission for Women website where we can place it below the Commissions Missions and Goals. The Commission would just need to

develop a proactive plan on what information they want to include on our state website. We also have Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and YouTube for the public as well. With these media platforms and the main Commission for Women website, the Commission can help direct the focus of the public without causing any confusion by having to navigate multiple websites.

Please let me know if you wish to agendize this matter for discussion on a future meeting, and I would be happy to do so.
