**SUBJECT:** Internet Explorer 11 Retirement

State employees have relied on Internet Explorer for many years to access critical state applications, and today Microsoft retires the last version of this browser, Internet Explorer 11 (IE11). Microsoft's new browser, Edge, replaces IE11 and should already be installed on most computers. To ensure access to legacy state applications, the recommended solutions below have been verified by the agency responsible for the application's maintenance and management; the Enterprise IT Services Division (EITS) does not manage or support these applications.

## What State Employees Can Do Now

State employees should stop using IE11 and follow the below steps to ensure their data, which includes bookmarks, is imported into Edge.

- 1. Launch Internet Explorer. Users should see the message: "This website doesn't work in Internet Explorer."
- 2. Scroll down to see the option to transition to Microsoft Edge and import favorites, preferences, and browsing data.
- 3. Click the blue "Get started" button.
- 4. Follow the steps to learn more about Microsoft Edge and know where to find imported information.

#### Other Legacy Applications That Use Internet Explorer

All in-house applications built by agencies that use IE11 are the responsibility of that agency to ensure compatibility with Microsoft Edge or another browser. State employees may be able to access any other legacy applications by using Internet Explorer mode (IE mode) on the Microsoft Edge browser. Note that every 30 days, users will recertify in Microsoft Edge that they want to continuing using IE mode. Long-term use of IE mode is not recommended because IE mode will no longer be available once IE11 is removed from state computers.

### What Comes Next for Internet Explorer 11

Though IE11 will still be available on state computers for the immediate future, continuing to use this outdated browser is not recommended as unsupported software products can create security vulnerabilities. Though state employees can turn off the option to automatically open Microsoft Edge when the IE icon is selected, doing so is highly discouraged. EITS will collaborate with agencies to broadly disable IE11 and to provide fixes to remove the IE icon from reappearing on taskbars and make necessary changes to the standardize image used to format state computers.
